The Department of Psychology at Bishop's University (Sherbrooke, Quebec) invites applications for a **10-month limited-term appointment position (Developmental)**, beginning July 1, 2024. We are seeking applicants with expertise primarily in developmental psychology with prior research experience falling within this area. The courses making up the bulk of the successful applicant's teaching load will be drawn from the following: Child Development, Adolescence and Adult Development. Other areas of interest for teaching are open and can be from a variety of areas such as sports psychology, cognition & motivation, forensic psychology, and history of psychology. Successful candidates will possess a PhD and be serious about teaching, as appointees will be expected to teach a total of six 3-credit courses over the Fall and Winter terms.

We anticipate delivering our courses in-person for 2025-25 but given our recent history in adjusting to teaching through the pandemic, applicants should be prepared to teach fully or partially online if necessary. The potential to provide high-quality teaching in any learning environment is therefore a factor in hiring. In addition to teaching, the ideal candidate will also have an interest in continuing to work toward furthering their research goals. We expect the candidate to teach on campus at Bishop's University during the academic year.

Applications, including a cover letter, curriculum vitae, evidence of quality teaching, a summary of research achievements and future research goals, and the names and contact information of at least three people available to provide letters of appreciation, should be emailed, **in a single PDF file**, to Executive Assistant to the Dean of Social Science, Monetta Gallichon (email: mgallich@UBishops.ca). The evaluation of applications will begin March 22nd and will continue until the position is filled. Only candidates selected for an interview will be contacted.
